MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Read Luke 12: 13-21

Dr. Robert Cook, the deceased former Chancellor of the King's College in Briarcliff Manor, New York, used to say, "Faith is only as good as its object". Let's think about that statement for a moment in light of the passage in Luke chapter 12.

In the passage, in response to a plea a man makes of Jesus concerning his brothers unwillingness to share the inheritance with him, Jesus issues a warning about being greedy. He says that a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions. To support his claim, Jesus tells a parable, (an earthly story with a heavenly meaning), about a rich man. He was so rich he had accumulated more wealth than he would ever need in life. He had so much wealth in fact, he felt he could now "sit back and enjoy the view", eat, drink and be merry because he'd never have to worry about money again. How many people only wish they were in this fellow's position?

Unfortunately for him, he didn't realize on that very night his life would come to an end and his riches couldn't save him. Someone else, would then, of course, inherit his wealth and get to "enjoy" every penny that man had accumulated throughout his life. This rich man had "faith" but he had placed his faith in his wealth, right? And, his wealth couldn't save him and why? Well it's because, "faith is only as good as its object" and, all the riches in the world can't buy us security in heaven. Only faith in the "right object" can, and that object is Jesus.

"I am the way, the truth and the life" he said and, "no one comes to the Father but by me". He also said: "I am the Resurrection and the Life, he who believes in me, though he die yet shall he live and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die".

What is the object you have entrusted your life to; money and wealth, possessions or power, your own abilities and strengths? These things sometimes fail us, and none of them can provide us with eternal security. Only faith in Jesus Christ can; entrust your life to Him!

No Estas Solo gets a new name, Love Lifts Us Up

Ms. Dana Silvey, Jersey Shore University Medical Centers, Pediatric Social Worker, asked the group if we might consider changing the name because the Spanish name was creating some difficulties for people in understanding who we are and what our group does. After listening to her recommendations and rationale, board members agreed and decided on the name *Love Lifts Us Up*.

Our mission remains the same with three goals: 1. To honor God 2. To offer assistance to families with seriously ill children in the Pediatric or Neo-natal units at Jersey Shore Hospital who are referred to us from the Pediatric Social Work Department and 3. To support the Pediatric and Neo-natal staff with our prayers and in other helpful ways.

Your gifts of support for this important work are so very appreciated. All monies received go from you directly into the hands of families in need. Thank you for your support. Money can be placed in the collection jars in Volharden Hall or sent to the Church office designed for: *Love Lifts Us Up*.

Jersey Shore Families in Need - New or gently used baby clothes wanted: Think about how many items a new baby needs....an endless list for sure! Especially needed are *New Born, 0-3 months and 3 months*. Please keep your eyes open at Yard Sales! (try to wash them and label the bag so they can be immediately distributed!)



Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Program: I know it's only early July but before you know it, it will be time for Shoeboxes! Just as a reminder, the following items are prohibited: food, candy, liquids, creams and tooth paste (tooth brushes are fine).

Most of these children have NOTHING. Their living conditions can't compare to our children and grandchildren. Most lack basic necessities. In many countries children can't attend schools if they don't have school supplies, so pens, pencils and paper (roll notebook paper for best results) are great!

Washcloths and Ivory Soap bars (Ivory Soap floats in lakes and streams) are so helpful to them. Socks, underwear and t-shirts are good items to include along with sneakers or flip flops. A simple game (marbles, tic tac toe) is perfect for *older children*, and stuffed animals or dolls, best for *younger children*.

For older children you can make a sewing kit and a piece of fabric for girls. For boys, make a fishing kit or a small tool kit. **These items may change a child's life! Items that make their home life better are as important as "play" items. THANK YOU FOR HELPING!**
