MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Read Luke 2: 1-20. Pay particular attention to verse 19.

What a year it's been, hasn't it? In my lifetime I can't think of another year that even comes close to all that we've encountered this year. It's been unsettling and a disturbing year for everyone. The Covid-19 pandemic has altered our lives completely. How have you been doing, how are you feeling in light of all that we faced and encountered? I can't imagine that it's been easy for anyone.

And yet, while we've experienced much this year, the year seems to have flown by quickly and here we are approaching Christmas. For many, I'm guessing, Christmas may not even feel the same as it has in years past? It will certainly be difficult for many families not being able to gather with their loved ones this Christmas. Travel will be restricted. Social gatherings will continue to remain limited. Those annual Christmas getaways will just have to wait until next year. There's a lot that weighs heavily on all of our lives this Christmas season.

While many of the normal "trimmings" of traditional Christmas celebrations will be left on the shelf this season there is something we can do that can "help make the season bright" as the old Christmas song states and Mary's heart and action shows us what it is. Luke 2:19 declares, following the shepherds visit to the manger when they told Mary and Joseph that they had been visited by an angel who told them, "Not to be afraid. I bring you good tidings of great joy which has come to all people. For to you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. Dr. Luke tells us Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." I really love that!

Mary responded to the shepherds account by concentrating her attention on that which is at the very heart of Christmas, the birth of a Savior, Christ Jesus, the Lord. That's what we should do too! While many of our "normal" Christmas activities will be limited and restricted this year, instead of allowing ourselves to be weighed down with sadness perhaps we should seize this opportunity to concentrate our attention on and ponder afresh that which remains at the very heart of Christmas, the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. As we "treasure" this, the true meaning of Christmas, Jesus' birth will help to lift us out of despair and fill our lives with hope to face all of life's painful trials, even Covid 19, in the confidence living a surrendered life to Christ can bring.

Annual Congregational Meeting is Sunday, January 17th, 2021




CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE AT OLD BRICK CHURCH



Christmas Eve December 24th at 7:30p

Service of Carols and Candles

Again this year, we will be holding our annual Christmas Eve Service of Candles and Carols



on Christmas Eve night, Thursday, December 24 at 7:30 pm. However, in keeping with the Covid-19 safety guidelines, we will have a number of restrictions.

First, sanctuary seating will be limited to 50 people, therefore, to maintain social distance, seating will be on a first come, first serve basis. Provisions are being made for "overflow" above 50 people in Volharden Hall. Seating will be available there for another 20 people where the service will be simulcast for your participation.

We are sorry for this inconvenience. However, to take as many precautions as possible this is, we believe, a necessary action. Ushers will be located at the sanctuary doors and in Volharden Hall to direct and assist. If attending service in person still leaves you unsettled, (and we certainly understand), you will be able to watch the service at home via a Zoom link that we'll be sending out a week or two before the service.

For those attending, everyone is required to wear a mask throughout the service. No offering will be received by ushers. Offering plates are available on either side of the chancel for your Christmas offerings. And, so that we spread no germs through the air blowing out our candles we've purchased electric candles that will be available to everyone upon entering the sanctuary.

To help us gain a better idea of how many people may be attending the Christmas Eve service in person, may we ask you to call the Church office (732-946-8860) and let us know how many people will be coming. Thank you.
