In the past year much has been happening. We had a new roof put on Volharden Hall (we were lucky it lasted a long time)! We had the peeling plaster and paint in the church repaired and painted. The painters did such a terrific job that you can't tell where the problem areas were. In order to do the painting we had the organ pipes taken down, cleaned and put back up.
